

## Family **BATHYSAUROIDIDAE**

## **Bathysauroides**Baldwin & Johnson 1996

bathýs (Gr.  $\beta\alpha\theta$ úς), deep, referring to deep-sea habitat; -oides, Neo-Latin from eidos (Gr.  $ei\delta o\varsigma$ ), form or shape, and saurus, from saúra (Gr. σαύρα), lizard, referring to superficial resemblance to lizardfishes (Synodontidae)

**Bathysauroides gigas** (Kamohara 1952) *gigas* (Gr. γίγας), giant, allusion not explained, perhaps referring to its "very large" eye, "large teeth on tongue," "large" ventral fin, and/or its larger size (285 mm) compared with *Bathysauropsis malayanus* (Ipnopidae, 244 mm), its presumed congener at the time
