

Bryconexodon

Géry 1980

brycon, generalized term used in generic names of many characiform fishes, derived from *brychō* (Gr. βρύχω), to bite, gnash teeth or eat greedily, originally an allusion to fully toothed maxillae but possibly used here alluding to its “general characid shape” (translation); *exodon*, referring to similarity to *Exodon*



Exodon

Müller & Troschel 1844

ex- (Gr. ἔξ) or *ἐξō* (ἔξω), outer or external; *odon*, Latinized and grammatically adjusted from the Greek nominative ὀδούς (*odoús*), tooth, referring to its outward-projecting teeth


Exodon paradoxus Müller & Troschel 1844 Latin for strange or contrary to expectation, presumably referring to the strange appearance of its outward-projecting teeth

Roeboexodon

Géry 1959

intermediate in form between *Roeboides* and *Exodon*

Roeboexodon guyanensis (Puyo 1948) -ensis, Latin suffix denoting place: French Guyana, where original specimens (now lost) were collected
