

Primitive Cave Eel

Family PROTANGUILLIDAE Johnson, Ida & Miya 2012

Johnson, Ida & Miya 2012

prốtos (Gr. πρῶτος), first, referring to the early divergence of this genus among anguilliforms; anguilla (L.), eel, derived from anguis (L.), snake, referring to snake-like body shape

Protanguilla palau Johnson, Ida & Sakaue 2012 named for the Republic of Palau, western Pacific Ocean, where holotype was collected from a 35 m-deep fringing-reef cave
