

Family SUDIDAE Fowler 1901

Sudis

Rafinesque 1810

sudis (L.), stake or pile and an ancient name for the barracuda (Carangiformes: Sphyraenidae), presumably referring to barracuda-like body of *S. hyalina*

Sudis atrox Rofen 1963 Latin for cruel, harsh or horrible, referring to its "formidable appearance" [author previously known as Harry]

Sudis hyalina Rafinesque 1810 *hyálinos* (Gr. ὑάλινος), of crystal (here meaning glassy or transparent), described as "Hyaline with various hues" (translation)
