

## Metavelifer Walters 1960

metá (Gr. μετά), after, i.e., after Velifer, "assuming [this] genus is more specialized than Velifer"

*Metavelifer multiradiatus* (Regan 1907) *multi-* (L.), many; *radiatus* (L.), rayed, referring to more dorsal- and anal-fin rays compared with *Velifer hypselopterus*, its presumed congener at the time

## Velifer

Temminck & Schlegel 1850 velum (L.), sail; fero (L.), to have or bear, referring to elevated dorsal fin, resembling a sail [proposed without species, which explains why genus predates species]

**Velifer hypselopterus Bleeker 1879** high-finned, from *hypsēlós* (Gr. ὑψηλός), high, and *pterus*, from *pterón* (Gr. πτερόν) or *ptéryx* (πτέρυξ), fin, referring to elevated dorsal fin
